



Summary of Collegiate Tennis Programs Dropped

(Updated as of 8/3/11)

1930-2011

The ITA has made its best effort to substantiate the statistics provided in this summary. The results of our research highlight the growing and alarming trend of the elimination of varsity collegiate tennis programs, especially men's teams. It should also be noted that we listed some programs that have been added, but this research does not detail programs that may have been added during the time frames referenced, although unfortunately this does not represent many programs. It is important to understand that the ITA Dropped Program Summary is compiled through third party reporting and is subject to updates and corrections as new information becomes available.

During the first decade of our research study (1970-1980), we have record of 6 programs being dropped. In the next decade (1981-1991), the rate of elimination increased ten-fold, with 60 known programs dropped. In the next decade (1992-2002), the rate of program elimination almost quadrupled, with 209 known programs dropped and more than 40% of these programs (92) dropped in the last three years of the decade. In addition, 175 programs were dropped over two decades (1981-2002), with precise years unknown. The trend of dropped programs appears to be continuing, with 120 programs known to have been dropped during the past eight years.

DIVISION I

335 schools are NCAA Division I members; and 259 schools sponsor men's tennis and 313 schools sponsor women's varsity tennis. A list of some of the programs that have been dropped in NCAA Division I are listed below. Of the schools that sponsor varsity tennis, 246 men's programs and 298 women's programs are ITA members.

NAIA

There are 286 member schools in the NAIA, but only 95 schools sponsor men's varsity tennis and 123 schools sponsor women's varsity tennis. Of the schools that sponsor varsity tennis, 73 men's programs and 77 women's programs are ITA members. . A list of some of the college tennis programs that have been dropped in the NAIA division are listed below.

According to membership data provided by the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics, NAIA, for membership from 1995 – 2000, men's tennis programs steadily declined from a high of 188 programs during the 1995-96 academic year to 107 programs in 2007-2008. Similarly, NAIA membership for women's tennis programs declined during the same time period from a peak of 197 programs in 1995-96 to a low of 122 programs in 2007-2008. It should be noted that some of this attrition may be the result of some NAIA programs moving affiliation to NCAA Division II or III.

Junior College

For 2009-10 there were 516 member schools in NJCAA, but only 74 schools sponsor men's tennis and 90 schools sponsor women's tennis. Of the schools that sponsor varsity tennis, 40 men's programs and 53 women's programs are members of the ITA. According to a membership report provided by the National Junior College Athletic Association, NJCAA membership for men's tennis programs has declined over the past decade from a high of 162 programs during the 1990-91 academic year to 79 programs in 2007-2008. NJCAA membership for women's tennis programs reached a peak of 128 programs in 1994-95, but has steadily declined to 95 programs in the 2007-2008 academic year. According to NJCAA data, men's tennis programs at all junior colleges in the State of Florida have been dropped.

In the latest California Community College Commission on Athletics (COA) Information Handbook, there was a list of 88 colleges of which 42 sponsored men's tennis, while 48 sponsored women's tennis. Of the schools that sponsor varsity tennis, 28 men's programs and 32 women's programs are members of the ITA.

STATISTICAL ANALYSES

CHART A: Gender Analysis

From 1971 – 2011 (to date), 360 men’s programs and 220 women’s have been eliminated. Men’s programs comprise 60% of the dropped programs which may lead many people to blame the unintended consequences of Title IX as the sole reason. However, the statistics show that 40% of the dropped programs have been women’s teams. Our research has found that other factors, including escalating costs, shrinking budgets, and reallocation of valuable real estate on which tennis courts sit, have contributed to the demise of collegiate programs.
